

Awana Discipline

Good discipline in Awana Clubs is required for the effectiveness of the program and the enjoyment of the clubbers.

To maintain proper behavior, we use two methods of discipline—one team wide and the other individually.

As a Team, clubbers can gain points by demonstrating positive behavior. Teams will be encouraged to behave courteously and to promptly obey leaders' instructions.

As an individual, a clubber may be disciplined using the three-count system.

First count: the clubber is warned and asked to stop the inappropriate behavior and advised of the consequences of continuing the unacceptable behavior.

Second count: if behavior is repeated, the clubber may lose game time and is taken to the director of their club, who discusses the inappropriate behavior with the clubber. The director will warn the clubber that further inappropriate behavior will result in his/her being sent home.

Third Count: the clubber will be sent home. The director will explain to his/her parents what led to this action.

Coming and Going Safely

Please make sure your child enters the building when you drop them off. We will not allow a child to leave club unless you or an identifiable alternate comes into the building to pick them up.

Each night in AWANA we rotate between three segments: Large Group Time, Small Group Time, and Game Time.
